



The Everyday Cowl

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Introduction:

Having a quick project that you can finish in 1 day and wear it immediately is awesome! This time I tried to design something quick, easy and at the same time give the rich texture. This cowl is very easy to make using 3 stitches only. It may look more complicated, but it is very easy and you will enjoy working on the Alpine stitches that are made from easy, basic stitches.

Skill Level: Easy to intermediate

Materials:

- **5 mm hook / H size**
- **Yarn: 300 yards/274 meters from “Knitologie Glowing Worsted” 40% merino, 30% silk 30% alpaca in Flying Trapeze color or any similar worsted yarn in the weight that obtains the correct gauge.**

Yarn weight: Worsted

Gauge: 14 sc x 17 rows = 10 cm

Size: one size

Measurements of the cowl:

Circumference: 28 inch /72 cm - Length: 9.5 inch / 24 cm

Stitches & Abbreviations:

Crochet Terms used in this pattern: US terms

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US Crochet terms		UK Crochet terms	
Ch	chain	Ch	chain
dc	Double crochet	tr	Treble crochet
sc	Single crochet	dc	Double crochet
fpdc	Front post double crochet	fptr	Front post treble crochet
hdc	Half double crochet	htr	Half Treble crochet

Instruction to how to use some stitches:

Fpdc

Yarn over, insert hook from front to back to front around post of corresponding stitch below, yarn over and pull up loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops, then yarn over and draw through the remaining 2 loops on the hook.

Pattern:

Ch 99, sl st to the first st to form a wide ring.

Round 1: ch 2 (counts as hdc), hdc in the next st and each st till the end, sl st to the 2nd ch. (99hdc) make sure not to flip your work before joining.

Round 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in the next st and each st till the end, sl st to the 3rd ch. (99dc)

Round 4: ch3 (counts as dc), *fpdc around the next st, dc in the next st, repeat from * till the end, sl st to the 3rd ch. (99 fpdc,dc).

Round 5: ch 1 (doesn't count as sc), sc in the same st, sc in the next st and each st till the end, sl st to the first sc. (99 sc)

Round 6: ch3 (counts as dc), * dc in the next sc, fpdc around the next dc st from round 4, repeat from * till the end, sl st to the 3rd ch. (99 dc,fpdc)

Note: fpdc and dc sts from this round should be staggered from those in round 4.

Round 7: repeat round 5

Keep repeating rounds 4, 5, 6 & 7 till you reach the desired length.

Last round: repeat round 1 (for the edge)

And your Cowl is done!



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
